The bell being rung for the commencement of the office, all rise and say in silence:





After Our Father and Hail Mary are said, let the Officiant begin Compline thus:





Come, bless the *Lord*, * all you *serv* ants of the Lord.



■ To be begun by one side, and they should be begun by a lesser person thus, and the petitions are said in alternation.









Let the Officiant say in silence:





I Let the following be said in unison:

■ Then follow petitions, by the Officiant, after this manner:





